IOSH Managing Safely is for those who manage or supervise anyone who may be exposed to hazards during their working day.

**Aims** The principal aims are to provide delegates with sufficient knowledge and information to allow them to discharge their supervisory function with respect to health and safety.

## Content

- Helping managers and directors create a safe and healthy working environment
- The supervisor's role with regard to risk assessment
- Workplace processes and their associated risks
- Workplace inspections and recording details
- Workplace precautions
- Taking into account the health and safety aspects when asking someone to carry out a task or job and providing the appropriate control measures
- Assessing existing health and safety conditions and procedures against set standards
- The procedure for reporting accidents, incidents and near misses
- Communicating guidelines for emergency procedures to all personnel

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- Communicating with all levels of management and personnel including others sharing or working in the same premises who may be employed by the organisation, including contractors, subcontractors and agency personnel.
- Co-ordinating contractors and understanding how to identify levels of competency
- How industry affects the environment and the ways in which individuals can minimise pollution and waste.
